WI, windward-inside, and LO, leeward-outside, are running and overlapped nearly bow-even toward the leeward mark to be rounded to port. At four boat lengths from the mark, LO luffs WI to the port side of the mark. Then, as WI reaches the two boat length zone (TBZ) ofm the mark, as she is now ½ length ahead because of the luff, LO bears away hard and abruptly, and rounds the mark leaving close to one boat length of room inside her. WI, because of her closeness to the mark is unable to bear away sufficiently to pass the mark on its required side, and protests LO for failing to give WI room (Rule 18.2(a)). LO claims that her maneuver at two boat lengths fulfilled her obligation under that rule. Who is right?

# US SAILING LEVEL 1 TRAINING COURSE

We are in the process of determining if CSA would benefit from an Instructor Training course this spring. Last spring a course was held and a group of instructors graduated that had a great effect upon Junior Camp, and a lesser effect on the Adult Sailing Seminar. The greatest impact of last year's training was the beginning of the Sunday Opti program. Our large group of certified young instructors did a fantastic job of making this a safe, fun and learning experience for the young kids of CSA. We are always interested in more certified instructors for the Junior program(both camp and the Opti program) and at this time we are especially interested in instructors for the adult sailing seminar.

This US Sailing Certification course can also benefit your fleet in that it provides strategies to more productively instruct new or potential sailors in your fleet. This is not a learn to sail course, although good sailing skills are a pre-requisite to the course. This is an intensive 4-day learn to teach sailing course. Utmost, successful completion of the course is rewarded with a million dollar liability policy from US Sailing which applies to all times you are teaching as an instructor.

We need a minimum of 6 interested individuals so that we can place the course on the calendar. The course, when offered at CSA is offered as an In-House course and is therefore priced substantially lower than the course regularly offered by US Sailing. 

## **E**GO

The proposed scantling rule changes to allow asymmetric spinnakers on the Scow failed by the narrowest of margins. It received nearly 60% approval, but needed 2/3. A number of sailors, perhaps enough to carry the day, voted no because they felt that the boat has undegone too many changes recently, and needed a respite from further change, or that the one year transition period was not long enough. Some, including the Rules Committee had recommended a three to five year transition. It is suspected that this issue is not dead, but will be resurrected during the coming year with the longer transition period and tighter tolerances on the sail itself.

#### Rules Quiz Answer

Rule 18.1 states that Rule 18, Rounding and Passing Marks and Obstructions, "applies when boats are about to round or pass a mark". About to round means when the boats are preparing for the rounding, which occurs prior to piercing the TBZ. Therefore, although overlap positions are assessed at the TBZ, Rule 18 is in effect for some distance before that, and LO is obligated during that extended period to give WI the required room, which she did not do. Therefore, LO has broken Rule 18.

## **GOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS ACTIVITIES**

Awards - Jim Harris has been active on behalf of CSA in this area for many years, and Ted Beier has become quite active in the past four years or so. Jim has been the president of the Carlyle Lake Association (CLA) since its founding, and was president of the Kaskaskia Watershed Association (KWA). He continues as a Director of both organizations. At the Kaskaskia Summit Conference (reported on here last month) Jim was presented with The U. S. Army Corps of Engineers Commander's Award for Public Service by the Commanding Officer of the St. Louis District of the Corps. This is the highest award the district gives, and presents it infrequently.

At the summit conference, U. S. Representative John Shimkus presented recognition plaques to the local organizations/individuals who worked with the displays at the White House Cooperative Conference on Conservation last August. Ted Beier, who replaced Jim as president of the CLA last November and is a director of KWA also, received one of these recognition awards on behalf of his efforts representing CLA.

Ted and Jim feel it is very important for CSA to be active in both CLA and KWA for many reasons. These organizations are active in promoting conservation programs for the watershed as well as cooperating on water control issues. Very simply, if we support the conservation efforts of those interests other than recreation/sailing, they are more likely to cooperate and support our needs in return.

Recent Meetings - Both KWA and CLA have had Board meetings in the past month. Also, the Corps presented a draft of their proposed changes to the Carlyle Lake Water Control Plan on 20 March. Much of the detail from these will be presented in a CLA newsletter, which will be published in mid April. Some quick highlights are:

- 1. The Corps Water Control Office has proposed a number of changes that will allow them more flexibility in releasing high water before, and during the recreation season. Also, they will have the flexibility to hold the lake at summer levels for two weeks into December to benefit the waterfowl hunters. These reciprocal changes were agreed by all interests, and are an example of the cooperation facilitated by CLA and KWA. This water control modification effort is moving in a desirable direction, but still requires our careful scrutiny.
- 2. CLA is supporting several conservation activities. One involves financing the planting of wetland grains to upgrade such areas in preventing erosion and providing waterfowl habitat. Another is taking the lead on developing a use and restoration plan for the portion of Carlyle Lake north of the trestle. This area has fallen in usage recently because of heavy siltation and loss of access. Hunting and fishing interests would like to see this reversed.

## **OPTI FLEET GROWS AT CARLYLE**

Thanks to a grant from the Carlyle Youth Sailing School, our 501 (C)3 organization, CSA has purchased 10 more Opties for the junior program. These boats are either new with some repaired blemish or reconditioned to new condition, and were obtained for a well discounted price of \$1500 each. List price for a new boat is \$2500. Each boat has new blades and sail.

Ideally, we would like to sell these boats to CSA families who will use them for several years for their kids, and then sell them to another CSA family, as the CSA culture has done with Sunfish in the past. Also, we will lease them for the various programs, as in previous years, but because of their superior value, the costs will be slightly more, and we will be more particular about damage. Additionally, we will give preference to CSA SSR families who want to purchase or want a full season or longer lease until the end of April. If there is sufficient purchase interest, and we know soon enough, we can and will get more boats from the builder at these prices.
